Over 60% of the plastic debris found in rivers and the sea are microfibres released from our clothing when washed. The microfibres found on our shorelines come from fabrics such as nylon, acrylic, polyesters. Research has discovered that laundering an average washing load releases more microfibres from acrylic than polyester or polyester-cotton fabric and that by adding conditioners more microfibres are released.
