#### **Registered Charity Number**

Q. Can an individual WI use the Federation Charity number?

A. Simple answer: No.

WIs with an annual income of  $\pounds$ 5000 or more should register with the Charity Commission and will be allocated their own charity number. Those WIs below  $\pounds$ 5000 annual income do not need to register and do not need to have a charity number. If they need to prove they are a charity, they should show a copy of the constitution, for example when opening a bank account, or applying for grants. Even if not registered, a small charity must comply with charity law.
