### **Coach Pick Up Points for Federation Trips**

It has come to our attention that some members are not happy about where coaches pick up on outings. Most coach companies allow in the cost quoted up to three pick up points and they usually let us know where the best places would be for each journey. We do understand that this may seem unfair to some, however we try to ensure as many members as possible are within a reasonable distance from a stop as possible. Extra stops not only adds time to the journey, with some members who get on first being on the coach up to two hours longer than those who get on last, this is something we have to consider, also an extra stop adds extra cost to the price of the coach which has then to be calculated into each ticket price.
