He has about 30 ties, and hasn't worn any for many years, other than a black clip on one for a funeral! Silk ties are preferable apparently, but I just opted for colourful ones that would suit my colour schemes. My first project was decorating an old plain plum coloured t-shirt with a lilac striped tie and I was very pleased with the result – very quick and easy to do. It just involved folding pleats around the neckline and stitching it into place. The next project – the cushion cover was more complicated. I unpicked an old maroon coloured cushion cover, then stitched the ties onto the front, and reassembled the cover. The jewellery pouch

was next – very simple to make with the broad pointed end of the tie, just folded under and a popper to close it. The necklace was a fun item – stitching the tie into a thin tube, then pushing beads through and knotting them into place. I have upcycled seven ties in all. Great fun!

### **Supporting Ukraine**

#### What happens when you get your period during a War?

At the time of writing, over 3 million refugees have escaped from Ukraine in the last two weeks; this does not include those displaced actually within the country. The majority of these refugees are women.

While their period arriving may be the least of their worries for women currently in a war zone, or for those who are fleeing as refugees, when the time of the month comes, access to period products is crucial — but it might not be possible.

Full of fear for the children, grabbing bare essentials, only what can be carried, having to say goodbye to brothers, fathers, husbands. These are indeed desperate times for these women who would be unable to bring the supply of period products with them that they might need. Some will have travelled for days without access to proper facilities. Shops are closed and many women fleeing will not have their own source of income to buy non-food items.

During conflict, women's specific needs are often overlooked, even in terms of the products people are sending to the borders. Period products are likely to be neglected. But as the majority of adults fleeing are women, the need will be great.

Ladies from Langtoft WI are collecting appropriate sanitary products along with cleansing wipes, bags for disposing of used items etc. specifically for women refugees and these will be delivered to the Ukraine Church in Peterborough.

# Resolution Result

This year there were **75,110** selections cast. **The NFWI Board of Trustees has agreed to put forward the top resolution to the Annual Meeting in June.** The wording of the resolution is as follows:

# Women and Girls with ASD & ADHD - under-identified, under-diagnosed, misdiagnosed, under-supported

Women and girls presenting with autistic spectrum disorder (ASD) and attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) are going undiagnosed. The NFWI calls on the government and funding bodies to fund research into the female presentation of ASD and ADHD, and for action to be taken to improve the diagnosis process for women and girls, to ensure that they are equipped to better manage these conditions and do not suffer in silence. The NFWI further calls on WI members to raise awareness within their WIs of the issues facing women and girls with ASD and ADHD.

#### What happens next?

Members now have the opportunity to learn more about the issues, and to discuss the resolution in their WIs before deciding how their Link delegate should vote at the Annual Meeting.

WIs are encouraged to hold discussion events to allow members to consider how they wish their delegate to vote. The NFWI will also be hosting a discussion event in April, so keep an eye out for more information about this.

#### How does my WI cast our vote?

All WIs get one vote - for or against the resolution.

WIs may choose to give their link delegate discretion to decide how to vote after hearing the speakers and the debate at the Annual Meeting. Please ensure your WI makes it clear to your link delegate whether you are granting her discretion.

Federation Representatives and link delegates attending in person will cast physical paper votes during the voting session. Federation Representatives and link delegates attending virtually will cast electronic votes via Electionbuddy during the voting session. Both physical voting papers and electronic voting links will be shared with Federation Representatives and link delegates in advance of the meeting. No votes may be cast before or after the meeting.
